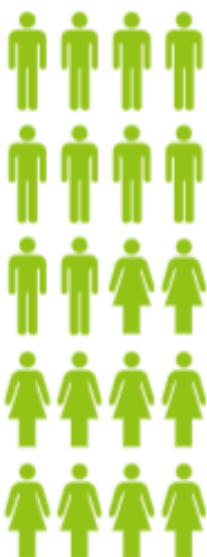

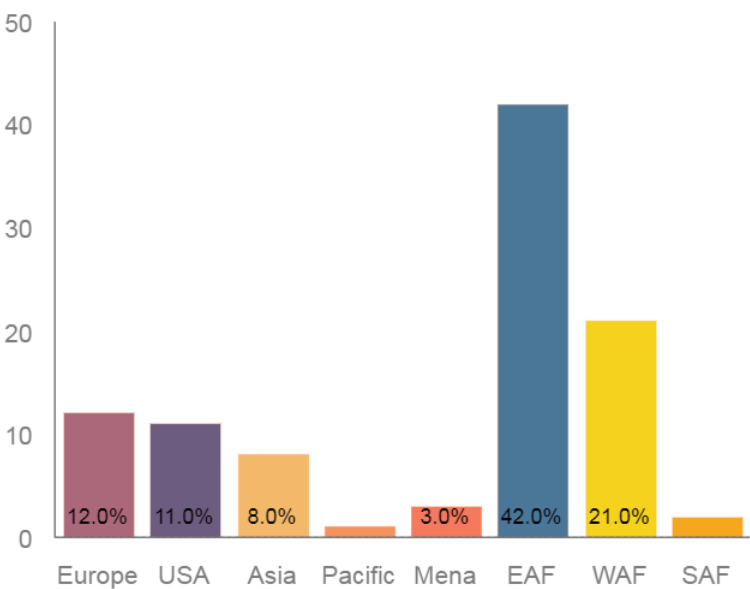

## Attendance

Participants attended from several regions, being the larger groups from Eastern and Western Africa (**63%**).



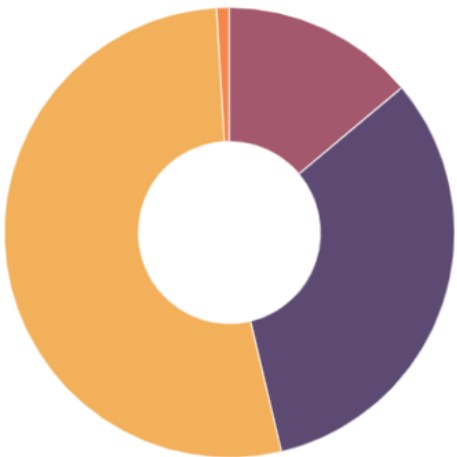
No experience	27.2%

## Experience with GALS

The group was almost equally divided between participants with and without experience with GALS.

## Plan to use GALS

After the workshop, most of the participants plan to use GALS in their projects either themselves or through colleagues (**84%**). Only a small percentage (**13%**) is still not decided.
